








No. 800 3-Point Hitch on Model "70" Tractor



No. 800A 3-Point Hitch on Model "60"




No. 801 Traction-Trol Hitch on Model "60" Tractor

GKCTCC Meeting Minutes Feb. 12, 2012 (2:00 p.m.) Trailside Center, Kansas City, MO

Attendance: 35

President Hrabik opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. No guests or new members were present.



Approval of November 6, 2011 meeting minutes as sent out in newsletter. Wes Storm moved and Bryce York seconded. Motion passed.

Bary Porter gave a financial report. In the Nov. meeting, the club donated \$200 to the Ag Hall board. Deposited \$125 for ads and dues. Auction brought in 956.75. Sent Harvesters a \$200 donation. Received money back on taxes and insurance of \$105. Deposited \$562 on sale of raffle tickets along with \$50 for dues. Purchased cards for \$169.83 and paid \$65 for Porta Potty at American Royal Parade. Closed out the year with a balance of \$6,230.76. In January collected \$225 in dues and collected \$225 in dues in February. As of this meeting the balance is \$6,730.76. Bryce York moved to approve and Joe Steineger seconded. Motion passed.

Jay Pruett presented the 2012 club budget as developed by the club officers, Jay Pruett, Bill Eagleberger, and Earl Knuth on January 28, 2012. He highlighted revenues will bring in about \$4,800. Charitable donations will be \$500 total. Club will decide where the funds will go. As a rule will try to make each event pay for itself -- will plan on spending around \$766 out of club funds. Administrative expenses are the newsletter and postage, website, door prizes, Ag Hall governorship, tax preparation, and insurance for a total of around \$3,034. The way the budget is set the club should have \$500 over expenses.

Installation of 2012 clubs officers (President, Don Hrabik, 1st Vice President - Bryce York, 2nd Vice President - Wes Storm, 3rd Vice-President - Bob Antes, Secretary - Justin Read, Treasurer - Bary Porter as recommended in November meeting. Duane Craig moved and Joe Steineger seconded. Motion passed. The president mentioned two goals for this year: (1) to have funds and (2) help where we can in the community. The president mentioned it would be his last year as president because at 80 it was time to let someone else be the President of a great organization. The President handed out small awards to people who went the extra mile in 2011 -- Bryce York, Wes Storm, Bob Antes, Justin Read, Bary Porter, Bill Eagleberger, Jay Pruett, Joe Steineger, Frank Van Fleet, Joe Meyer, Duane Spieker, Marietta Rogers, Glenn Ratzlaff, Duane Craig, John Didde, Andrew DuBois, and Mike Corum.

The Western Farm Show was discussed. Will set up on Tuesday, February 21 around 3:00 p.m. Club tractor with row cultivator and Earl Knuth's JD 30U with planter will be the featured tractors. Toys with implements will also be a part of the display. Glenn Ratzlaff will display pictures along with some plants.

Tractor Daze at the Ag Hall on July 14, 2012 was discussed. Activities will be similar to last year with the same sleds for the large tractor pull and the garden tractor pull along with two pedal tractor pulls. A tractor and equipment display will also be included. Tractor games are scheduled at 4:00 p.m. if there is enough help. Last year we had two problems with the large tractor pull (1) not enough help on the registration table and (2) we need to start as close as possible to 10:00 a.m. It was pointed out that many of the pullers waited to the last moment to register. Need to make the announcements sooner and get the sled there earlier. Rules for the large pull are the same as last year and are on the back of the flyer. It was also suggested that we put a sign that the pullers start signing up at 7:30 a.m. It was also suggested someone get the tractors lined up for their class pull. Another suggestion was the flyer includes earlier registration (8:00 a.m.).

The Ag Hall of Fame Tractor Cruise was discussed. It will be on May 5, 2012 and flyers will be available at the meeting. The letter will be sent out after the Western Farm Show. The 38-mile route was discussed -- starting at the Ag Hall with the morning break at the Grinner House. Lunch at the Wyandotte County Lake, the afternoon break at Cabelas, and then back to the Ag Hall around 4:20 p.m. for dinner. During dinner, gift cards will be given out to some luck winners. Tow trucks will be provided by Overland Tow Service. Wyandotte County Sheriff's staff will be a part of the cruise. Thanks to Dan Hanna for setting the bar in the past with the Dream Factor Tractor Cruise. Joe Steineger made a pitch for the Ag Hall Tractor Cruise. The big projects right now are developing an update to the mailing list.

The 2012 Schedule of Events was discussed. If there are any changes they will be made and the list will be approved at the April 1st meeting.

Next meeting will be at Joe Meyers (Overland Park Tow) on April 1.

Earl Knuth mentioned a planting day on April 28 during Barn Yard Babies.

Bryce York moved the club donate \$50 to the Trailside Center for the use of their facility. Marvin Halverson seconded. Motion passed.

QUALITY FEATURES





Trivia Answer:

The 800 Series (800 / 800A / 801) 3-Point Hitches had two major changes:
1). The Lift Links on both sides were converted to identical leveling screws with adjustment straps, attached with different cast forks. These were used on both the 800A and 801 (Fig 2).

2). An extra hole was added for more lift capacity in both Lift Cranks (Fig 1). The same Lower Draft Links were used on all versions of the Hitch (Fig 3). The same Upper Links were used on the 800 & 800A but were changed on the 801 version (Fig 4).
