## American Royal Parade -- September 29, 2012, 10 AM

The unloading will be the same as last year at the Governors Exposition Building (American Royal Complex), 1900 Genessee Street, Kansas City, MO 64102. It will be the south lot under the bridge. This is the same area where we unload and load tractors for the Western Farm Show. Detailed directions are included with the schedule of events (Page 7). We should be there early (7:00 a.m.) in order to miss the traffic. We will leave the parking lot no later than 8:15 a.m. sharp for the line up because it will be a little further to go to the line up. The club will have a trailer for riders with a banner that says the "OTHER DEARS" and hopefully we will fill it. We plan to use the same American Royal flags as last year for the tractors since they are not dated. 

#### **GKCTCC Pot Luck Meeting Minutes.**

June 3rd, 2012 National Agricultural Center and Hall of Fame Attendance - 32

Pot Luck started at 1:00 p.m. with Meeting starting at 2:01 p.m.

The President opened the meeting with the flag salute.

The President ask if any new members or guests were present.



The President ask for approval of April meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. It was moved by Don Hrabik after advising that the minutes were a bit brief. Seconded by Justin Read, motion passed.

Mr. Bary Porter was not available to give a financial report.

The Ag Hall Tractor Cruise was discussed. The current total given to the Ag Hall of Fame looks to be in excess of \$15,000 (as some of the donations have been pledged but not turned in yet).

The John Deere 175th Anniversary Celebration in Olathe Kansas was discussed by Justin Read. It was noted that we had 15 tractors and the employees were very appreciative we were involved in the event.

Tractor Daze scheduled for July 14th was discussed. The club flyer for the event will be in the next newsletter. Club events will be similar to last year with the exception of caterpillar dirt moving activities and judged plowing no longer on the schedule. Tractor pull tracks will need to be graded one week before pulls (scheduled for July 7th at 8:30 p.m. Mike Corrum is to provide the pull back tractor again this year for the large tractor pull. Moving the track was discussed again, but it was decided to table this discussion for another time.

The American Royal Parade was discussed which is Saturday, Sept. 29 in Kansas City, MO. The theme for the parade is to be announced (*Tribute to the American Military*). Bill Eagleburger will check on unloading and loading area -- probably the same as last year under the bridge. The "other dears" banner will be used again for the float. Flags for the tractors will be available for the parade. A trailer gate party is planned following the parade.

The Missouri State Fair parade is scheduled for Thursday, Aug. 9, 2011 in Sedalia, MO starting at 6:00 p.m. It was discussed that there is a strict limit of 10 tractors per entry, Bill advised that just means we may have two entries in the parade if we have more than the limit.

The requests for tractors was discussed again. The Foxwood Springs event was cancelled due to lack of car club participation and the Lamar Court event did not pass at the last meeting. A request for tractors to be displayed in the west bottoms and the KC Pumpkin Patch was discussed. A motion was made by Bob Surber (seconded by George Reed) to decline these events as our schedule has already been approved for 2012, motion passed.

The Adrian Show was discussed as it is around the corner, flyers were available on the table.

The club meeting / white elephant auction was briefly discussed. Mr. Duane Craig will host the event at the Pioneer Village in Adrian, MO. This would be a great opportunity to increase the club funds by having some nice things that everyone might want. The raffle was discussed and a letter with tickets were handed out by Jay Pruett. We made \$1800 income with this last year. This year the prizes will be as follows: ONE \$250 cash prize and FIVE \$50 cash prizes.

Door prizes were won by Harold Kurzweil and Jared Arnote.

It was moved and seconded to close the meeting. Motion passed.

I-670 to Gennessee (Exit 1B). At second stop sign, turn left onto Gennessee St.


### From the South:

I-29/I-35 to I-670 (Topeka) to Gennessee (Exit 1B). At second stop sign, turn left onto Gennessee St.


## Take Gennessee south 3 blks and take a right on American Royal Dr. Lot A is on the left after passing Kemper & Governors Bldg.



#### Trivia Answer:

The John Deere No. 109 was a "GPO" adapted with special rubber-tires for use on golf courses. Golf fans know John Deere as the sponsor of the annual John Deere Classic, but the companies connections to the sport date back much further. Deere was an early equipment supplier to course owners, offering a special rubber-tired use on golf courses in the 1920s, but by then the company and its employees were already a part of the game's history. Jack Cady, John Deere's grandson, won a silver medal as part of the United States golf team at the 1904 Summer Olympics. Years before, Cady and Burton Peek, John Deere's great-nephew and fifth president of Deere & Company, helped introduce golf to the Moline, Illinois, area. The pair worked with others to organize a golf club in nearby Rock Island in 1897, just a few years after the first golf club in the United States was organized. Peek was an avid golfer for the rest of his life and an early member of Augusta National Golf Course in Augusta, Georgia. A cabin he built near the 10th hole, "one of just 10 cabins remaining on the course," is still known as the Peek Cabin. Today, along with serving as the sponsor of the John Deere Classic golf tournament, John Deere is the Official Golf Course Equipment Supplier, Landscape Product Supplier and Golf Course Equipment Leasing Company of the PGA TOUR.
