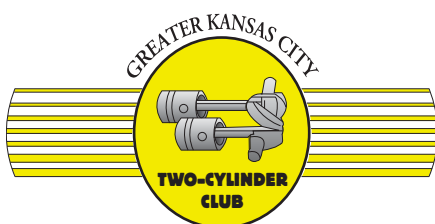
Sugar Creek Parade -- July 4th, 2014

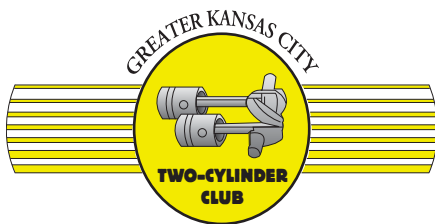

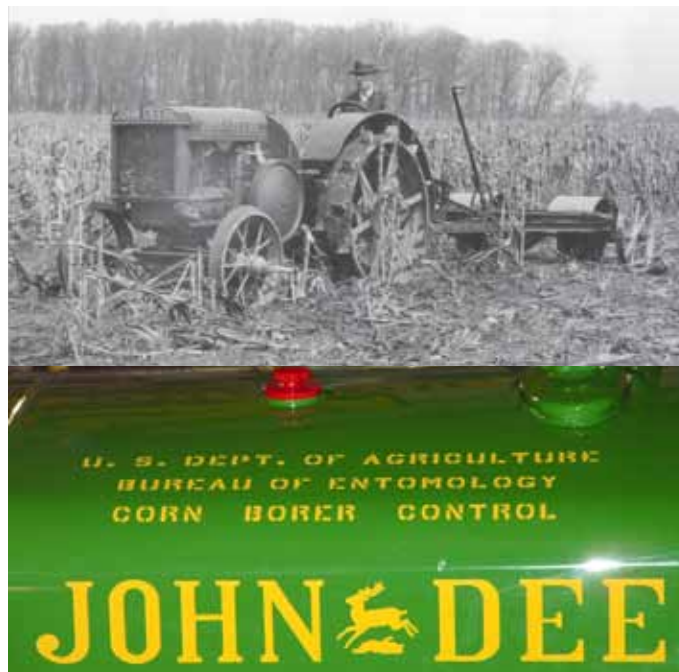

Trivia Answer:

The 1927 John Deere Corn Borer D. A total of 444 tractors were built March 10 - April 20 (serial # range 46922 - 47675) for the U.S.D.A. European Corn Borer Control project. Congress had passed appropriations of \$10 million in 1927 for use in fighting the European Corn Borer. All of these tractors were equipped with a power take-off (P.T.O.) to run a McCormick - Deering stubble beater. The Corn Borer D tractors had a white fan, and as this would have been a governmental safety requirement. Specifications: The 1927 Model D was designed to pull a 3 - 14" plow and the tractor weighed 4090 lbs. It had a wheelbase of 109 inches, stood 56 inches tall, and was 56 wide. The 465 cubic inch engine was rated at 15 drawbar horsepower and 27 belt horsepower @ 800 RPM. The tanks held 18 gallons of kerosene and 2.5 gallons of gasoline.
