Trivia Answer:

The 1928 Model GP had an exclusive industry first feature.... a mechanical lift operated by a foot pedal. The mechanical lift was a John Deere first and quickly became copied by other tractor manufacturers. The original GP had a bore and stroke of 5.75" by 6", and running at 900 rpm it was rated at 10 hp at the drawbar and 20 hp at the belt. In 1930 the bore was increased to 6 inches. The water injection system was also dropped as many farmers reported plugging. Modifications to the Model GP raised these ratings to 15.5 drawbar hp and 24.3 belt hp (950 rpm) as tested at Nebraska in 1931. Total built: 30,535 GP Standard, 5,103 GP Wide Tread, 717 GPO (Orchard). Original price: \$1,200 (1931)
