

#### GKTCC Meeting Minutes February 7, 2021 — 1 PM Trailside Center, Kansas City, MO

President Read opened the meeting with the flag salute. No new members or guests were in attendance.

The meeting was also attended via Free Conference Call by a few members.

Installation of 2021 Club Officers was completed with the Officers as follows:

President – Justin Read; 1<sup>st</sup> VP – Jon Pirie; 2<sup>nd</sup> VP – Joe Meyer; 3<sup>rd</sup> VP – Lloyd Mesmer; Treasurer – Jay Pruett; Secretary – Michelle Pirie; Historian – Wes Storm

The President sked for approval of the November meeting minutes as published in the last newsletter. Wes Storm moved to approve, Don Hrabik & Lloyd Mesmer seconded, motion passed.

Justin Read explained the new/current insurance policy will be for tractor club sponsored events only. The current amount is \$869.00 per year which is base insurance plus the number of events at about \$25 per event plus \$1.75 per member. If a claim needs to be filed, it must go through a board member. Non-insured events will no longer be listed in the newsletter, but will be included on the website.

The Shawnee St. Patrick's Day Parade has been canceled. Western Farm Show has been canceled.

The next GKCTCC meeting is scheduled for April 18, 2021 with Joe Meyer hosting. The plan still includes lunch and silent auction. The June meeting is scheduled June 6, 2021 at the Ag Hall of Fame with a picnic subject to the local health department decision which will be made closer to date. There is still an opening for hosting the Nov. 7, 2021 meeting.

The Ag Hall Tractor Cruise is scheduled for May 1, 2021. Lloyd Mesmer provided details regarding possible start location, route, and place to eat lunch. Late arrivals will be accepted but with no guarantee of lunch. Lloyd is still working out details.

An Ag. Hall Tractor Show was discussed with possible dates of July 10<sup>th</sup> or July 31<sup>st</sup>. This activity is no cost to the Club. It is sponsored by the Ag. Hall. Don Hrabik is working on this and will bring more information to the April meeting.

Jon Pirie discussed the raffle and scholarship fund for 2021. Jon suggested investing in Duane Spieker buttons. Wes Storm motioned to invest in the Spieker buttons and Jon Pirie 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed. Tickets for the raffle will be ready by the April meeting to help increase fundraising. The scholarship awards will remain the same for now. The tickets for the raffle will be \$2 for 1 and \$5 for 3 again this year. Don brought up the need to spread the prize money out more this year, as opposed to last year having only 3 prizes, to help have more winners. VPs in charge of the program agreed to this change.

It was decided to not do event buttons this year due to the decrease in events last year and this year due to COVID-19. Don Hrabik stated there is a credit on the account where we purchase the buttons. This credit will be used for the Duane Spieker buttons.

A financial report was read by Justin Read as Jay was unable to attend.

Joe Meyer asked about hats for the tractor cruise. The decision for this will be made by April 1, 2021. They will have no year and no date so they can be used in the future.

Justin Read will get Don the picture of Spieker for the button.

Justin Read presented service gifts to the 2020 officers that were present. Wes Storm, Joe Meyer, Jon Pirie, Lloyd Mesmer and to Don Hrabik for all that they do for the Club.

Wes Storm motioned to donate \$50 (paid cash) to the Three Trails Center. Don Hrabik 2<sup>nd</sup>, motion passed.

## Member Profile: Who is Lloyd Mesmer?

Lloyd K. Mesmer was born September 12, 1936 in Holton, KS the second of three children born to Jessie and Joseph Mesmer. Lloyd's sister, Shirly Ann, lives in Topeka and is 2 years his senior. Lloyd's younger brother by 4 years, Leonard Gale Mesmer, died in 2012 when he suffered a heart attack. Lloyd lived in Holton, KS until he was about 8 years old when the family moved to a 40 acre farm in Rossville, KS, part of 160 acres Joseph ultimately obtained. Lloyd grew up on the Rossville farm where wheat was raised, initially with a team of horses. During WWII, Lloyd's dad received approval to purchase a 1940's John Deere "skeleton wheel" tractor. When the steel wheel tractor was unable to perform as needed, Joseph sought and received approval from the board to purchase a second John Deere (model A or B) with rubber tires.

Lloyd graduated from high school in 1954 and worked as a farm hand putting up hay, plowing, and operating a combine. Lloyd helped drill irrigation wells for Cox irrigation before getting in the bridge building business in 1955 when he helped build a 2,997 ft. bridge in the Kaw Valley to replace a trestle bridge lost in the 1951 flood.

Lloyd married his wife, JoAn Buchanan, in 1960 and they initially lived in a mobile home on the 40 acres in Rossville where Lloyd was raised. Lloyd and JoAn had two children, Brenda born in 1961 and William born in 1965. Brenda currently resides in Bonner Springs. William currently resides in Olathe with wife Sheri and daughter Autumn (Lloyd's only grandchild). Lloyd moved from the farm to Bonner Springs, KS in 1966 and they moved into their current home in 1967. Lloyd earned a living through the years driving piles in the bridge building business, 25 years of which was spent with Wilkerson from 1975-2000 when he retired as a project superintendent.

Through the years, Lloyd has served the city of Bonner Springs, KS as a member of: the city council, zoning appeals and planning commission, and the tree board. The Mayor of Bonner Springs encouraged Lloyd to volunteer at the Agriculture Hall of Fame and he has served there the past 5 years. Lloyd has been a member of the GKCTCC for the past 12 years helping coordinate the tractor cruise and plow days and currently serving as a Vice-President.

Lloyd owns four tractors, all of which he has restored, including: 1946 JD all fuel GM, 1950 JD AR, 1958 JD 620 LP and a 1955 Ford 850. Most of Lloyd's tractors are kept in an out-building on the 40 acre farm in Rossville where Lloyd was raised and which he now owns.
