President Read opened the meeting with the flag salute at 2:02 PM Joe and Lori Meyer thanked for hosting meeting and the excellent BBQ dinner Stacey Speiker thanked for helping establish the Duane "Spike" Speiker scholarship

Introduction of new members: Jerry Seifert

Introduction of guests: Kenny and Carla Henz, Fred Seimore, Kate and Alley Arnote

President Read asked for approval of the Feb 7, 2021 meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. Wes Storm moved and Bryce York seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer Pruett was unable to attend and the financial report was tabled until the next meeting.

The silent auction was referenced and participation was encouraged. A live auction followed the meeting.

Vice-President Lloyd Mesmer discussed the Ag. Hall Tractor Cruise scheduled to occur May 1, 2021. There were only 21 drivers registered for the cruise and a higher level of participation was encouraged. Help was requested for the morning of the event. An 8:00 AM gathering time and 8:30 departure from LV CO fairgrounds. The route includes some pavement, some gravel with first rest stop in McLouth followed by lunch in Oskaloosa. Alternate return route to LV CO fairgrounds and conclusion of the cruise.

### Member Profile: Who was Joe Meyer?

Joseph L. "Joe" Meyer was born March 7,1954, the first of ten children born to James and LaVerne Schmitt Meyer. Joe was born and raised in Huntingburg, Indiana on the 250 acre family farm where they raised various livestock including turkeys (10,000 at a time from hatchling to full size). Crops were also produced on the farm, including corn kept in harvestores on the property. A Farmall, Oliver and a couple of John Deere tractors were operated on the farm and Joe spent a lot of time on the family's JD 530.



Joe graduated from high school in 1972 and moved to Grandview, MO to attend technical school. Joe met Lori Spieker in 1980 and they were married October 30,1982. Together, Joe and Lori owned and operated multiple businesses including Overland Tow Service. Joe and Lori have three married children, Chris and Jodie Meyer, Dusty and Erin Meyer, Jon and Hannah McPherson. Joe and Lori have four grandchildren: Brandon, Farrah, Calvin, and James.

Joe enjoyed BBQ competitions, motorcycling, hunting and fishing. Joe was a race car builder and drag racing enthusiast and passed his love of the sport on to his children, each of whom he built cars to race. Joe enjoyed collecting and restoring antique John Deere Tractors and was a member of the Greater Kansas City Two-Cylinder Club (GKCTCC). While serving as vice-president of the GKCTCC, Joe was instrumental in implementing and maintaining two memorial scholarships, one in the name of his father-in-law, Duane "Spike" Spieker who joined the tractor club a few years after Joe. Joe and Duane participated in tractor club events together including driving their respective tractors in community parades.

Joe's tractor collection began in 1994 when Joe and 10-year old son Chris went to an auction and purchased a 1937 John Deere B. One year later, Joe bought a 1938 A and both tractors were restored.

Joe Meyer lost his life in a tragic work-related accident on April 29, 2021. Services for Joe were very well attended by the multitude of people who Joe had known and impacted.
