GKCTCC Meeting Minutes

Date: June 6, 2021

Time: 1 PM Sack Lunch/Picnic, 2 PM Meeting

Place: Agricultural Center and Hall of Fame, Bonner Springs, KS

President Read opened the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Meeting was attended by 18 members, no new members or guests were present.

President Read asked for approval of the April 18, 2021 meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. Herman Sachse moved and Bob Antes seconded. Motion passed.

Financial report, forwarded by Treasurer Jay Pruett, was read by President Read. Report detailed total funds: \$13,454.30 with \$3,685.98 designated for scholarships and \$9,768.32 in general fund. President Read asked for approval of the financial report and Vice-President Jon Pirie moved and Herman Sachse seconded. Motion passed.

President Read referenced funds had been donated to the GKCTCC in Vice-President Joe Meyer's memory. Consideration of a memorial scholarship in Joe Meyer's name will be discussed in the future. In honor of Joe Meyer, his Vice-President Position will remain unfilled until next year.

Vice-President Jon Pirie discussed the Memorial Scholarship Raffle and the fact that tickets were available to distribute to club members following the meeting.

President Read referenced the Ag. Hall Tractor Cruise held May 1, 2021 and Vice-President Lloyd Mesmer was given the floor. Discussion revealed 40 tractors were registered for the 2021 Tractor Cruise, however not all registered tractors participated. The tractor cruise raised \$2,800 for the Ag. Hall. Lloyd Mesmer, Wes Storm, and Don Hrabik were thanked for their efforts related to the 2021 Cruise. VP Mesmer advised he was in the process of planning the route and details for the 2022 Tractor Cruise with a tentative date of May 7, 2022.

Don Hrabik discussed the Ag. Hall Tractor Show to be held July 31 from 9 AM – 4 PM with tractors to be in place by 8 AM the day of the event (earlier arrivals on Thursday/Friday allowed). Bob Antes is in charge of the tractor games to be held at the show and information about some of the tractor games was provided.

President Read referenced pending tractor events listed in the newsletter and website. The Leavenworth County Fair Parade in Tonganoxie, KS on July 27 was referenced as needing a club member to coordinate participation for the club. Jeff Gast volunteered to coordinate the event on behalf of the club.

President Read discussed timing of the next club newsletter and a decision was made to disseminate the newsletter after mid-August.

President Read advised a location for the November meeting has yet to be determined and asked club members to forward any information or suggestions on potential locations or persons who might be willing to host the meeting. Herman Sachse nominated the Read farm as a location for the next meeting. President Read will check on it.

President Read opened the floor for discussion and Don Hrabik advised a new batch of Duane "Spike" Spieker Memorial Scholarship buttons had been created with Spike's name spelled correctly. Don also asked if the GKCTCC would donate \$200 to the Ag. Hall on for the Ag Hall Board of Directors position he serves. Justin advised the club typically handles such requests at the November meeting.

President Read called for a motion to close the meeting. Herman Sachse moved to close the meeting and Vice-President Jon Pirie seconded. Motion passed at 2:54 PM.

Member Profile: Who is Don Hrabik?

Donald Hrabik was born June 29, 1932, the second of four children born to Henry and Viola. During elementary school, the family lived on a small family farm in Wilson, KS. Don's dad worked at the local flour mill during the day and would return home and plow at night on a 1929 John Deere D tractor. During high school, the family moved to a farm in Dorrance, KS. In 1950, following high school, Don worked for the Russell Highway Department running a Caterpillar D-8 tractor/scraper building roads.

During the Korean War, Don was #2 on the draft list and chose to enlist in the Army. Don completed 8 weeks of basic training followed by 16 weeks of engineering school, qualifying him to work on any piece of heavy equipment in the Army. In 1952, Don was assigned to the K-13 airbase in Suwon, Korea as a member of the 802nd EAB (Engineering Aviation Battalion), a SCARWAF (Special Category Army with Air Force) unit keeping heavy equipment operational to maintain the air strip used by F-86 Sabres. Fighting in Korea stopped July 27, 1953 and Don's service concluded in 1955. Don's military service allowed him to participate in a Washington D.C. honor flight in 2019, a highlight of his life.



Following the war, Don worked a few years with Lane Wells in Russell, KS servicing oil wells. Intending to teach school, Don attended Fort Hays State College. In 1958,

Don married Janice before graduating college and getting hired to teach Industrial Arts in Burlington, KS. One year later, Don was hired to teach Metals at the Old Mission Jr. High School in the Shawnee Mission School District. Don was awarded Teacher of the Year in 1974. In the 1980's, Don was named principal of the Broadmoor Vo-Tech School. Don retired from teaching in 1993. Don and Janice have two boys, Brent and Bradley who both work in the medical field and each have families. Brent and Brad have given Don and Janice six grandchildren, four boys and two girls.

Don became a member of the GKCTCC in 1995, served as club president over 10 years, and is known for his ability to sell copious amounts of tractor club raffle tickets. Don has been associated with the Ag Hall

of Fame about 15 years and is presently serving on the board of directors. Don's tractor collection has included as many as 65 pedal tractors, currently down to about 25. Don's collection of large tractors at one time included his dad's Minneapolis Moline U purchased new in 1952, sold to club member Wes Storm. Don currently owns a 1958 John Deere 430 W (w/ siren) and 520, both previously owned by Paul Antes. Don's collection once included a 39 John Deere A, John Deere H, 49 John Deere B, another 430 W (without power steering), a Dearborn Award winning Ford 8N, and too many lawn mowers models to list.
