## GKCTCC Meeting Minutes April 10, 2022 – 1 PM Ag Hall of Fame, Bonner Springs, KS

Following a barbecue dinner, the meeting was called to order by President Herman Sachse at 2:08 PM. New members and guests were introduced including: Marshall Patterson, Larry Henak, Chris Meyer, and Stacy Spieker.

President Sachse asked for approval of the November 7, 2021 meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. Justin Read moved to accept and Bryce York seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer Jay Pruett provided a financial report including a spreadsheet detailing 2021 transactions relative to the current budget. Total club funds \$12,540.28 with \$8,290.28 in the general fund, \$1,847.50 in the scholarship fund, and \$2,402.50 in donations from the Joe Meyer family. Jon Pirie moved to accept the financial report and Wes Storm seconded, motion carried.

3<sup>rd</sup> Vice-President Lloyd Mesmer provided details regarding the upcoming Barnyard Babies scheduled for April 23, 2022 from 10 AM- 4 PM.

Lloyd Mesmer discussed the upcoming Ag Hall Tractor Cruise set for May 7, 2022. Lloyd provided details surrounding the 42-mile route, break and lunch locations.

The next tractor club set for June 5, 2022 at 1 PM—Ag Hall (building to be determined day of) was announced. Attendees are welcome to bring a picnic/sack lunch with the meeting to follow.

Lloyd Mesmer was asked about the Ag Hall Tractor Show with tentative dates set for either July 23 or July 30, 2022. Lloyd advised a date for the tractor show has not been set and more information will be provided later.

2<sup>nd</sup> Vice-President Justin Read provided a review on the tractor club insurance with the cost being approximately \$869.00 per year. Insurance cost is derived from the base price plus \$25 per event and \$1.75 per member. Other options are being considered.

President Sachse sought approval of the 2022 Schedule of Events, as published in the previous newsletter. Justin Read moved to accept the schedule and Bryce York seconded. Motion passed.

1<sup>st</sup> Vice-President Jon Pirie was asked for details on the pending Scholarship Fundraiser and date raffle tickets will be available for sale. Jon advised it is premature to start selling raffle tickets since the drawing will be held in November.

Jon Pirie was asked for and provided a summary of the Shawnee ST. Pat's Parade.

Jay Pruett announced 2022 will be the last year he will serve as treasurer. The announcement was made in hopes that a successor will be identified so familiarization can occur creating a smooth transition.

President Sachse concluded the formal meeting at 2:43 PM.

# Member Profile: Who was Duane Spieker?



Duane "Spike" Spieker was born to Lawrence and Viola Spieker July 13, 1932 in Carroll, Iowa. Duane was the oldest of twelve children; 6 boys and 6 girls. The Spieker family were crop and livestock farmers and farmed in various locations in Carrol County, Iowa. Tractors on the farm included a 1942 John Deere model B and Farmall model M. While on the farm, Duane developed a knack for diagnosing and repairing vehicles and farm machinery, skills he continued to build upon throughout his life.

Duane graduated from Sacred Heart High School in Templeton, Iowa in May, 1949. Following graduation, Duane worked on the family and neighbor farms. Duane briefly worked as a mason for the city, and later as a truck driver for Don Fuchs Trucking in Templeton, Iowa.

Duane was inducted into the Army on December 2, 1952, and completed basic training at Camp Crowder (southwest Missouri). Duane then transferred to Ft. Sill (Oklahoma) where he trained and was assigned to a field artillery unit before being deployed to Korea. While serving in Korea, Duane utilized his skills as a mechanic distinguishing himself during missions repairing military vehicles when Army-trained mechanics were unavailable. Duane credits his rapid promotions on his ability to repair vehicles under difficult circumstances. Duane was honorably discharged as a Sgt 1st Class on December 1, 1954.



Duane returned to Iowa where he worked as a mechanic until November, 1955 when he took advantage of the GI Bill moving to Kansas City, MO to study electronics at the Central Technical Institute (CTI). Duane met Audrey Taylor of Jefferson, Iowa in 1955. Audrey was from a farm family of 11 children and she and Duane found they had much in common and married December 29, 1956.

In April, 1957, Duane put his electronics training to work at Bendix Aviation Corporation, in Kansas City, as an electronics inspector. Duane enjoyed a successful 40-year career at Bendix serving in several management positions and becoming known for his technical acumen, work ethic, honesty and fairness.

Duane had many interests including spending time with family and friends. Duane enjoyed motorcycles and motorcycling as a member of the ROMEO (Retired Old Motorcyclists Eating Out) club putting an estimated 100,000 miles on his street bikes over a 20-year period. Duane also enjoyed driving John Deere tractors, belonging to him or his son-in-law Joe Meyer, in local parades as a member of the Greater KC Two-Cylinder Club. Duane owned and restored a 1951 John Deere model R which was later inherited by Joe Meyer and then passed down to Joes' son, Chris Meyer.





Duane and Audrey were blessed to have seven children and twenty grandchildren.

Audrey died of cancer October 5, 2007 and Duane died of cancer June 24, 2013. Based on Spike's passion for early John Deere tractors and the tractor club, Duane's family made the initial donation to the GKCTCC to start a memorial scholarship in Duane's honor.
