Member Profile: Who is Robert L. Antes?

Robert "Bob" Antes was born March 1, 1943, in Denver, Colorado to John and Della Antes. Bob was the third born of eleven children and oldest boy with four sisters and six brothers. When John Antes (dad) got lead poisoning in 1943 marshalling ammo containers at Lowry Field, the Antes family returned to Northeast Kansas and purchased a 40-acre farm near Effingham where Bob was raised.

Bob's dad farmed while also working for Center Township in charge of road maintenance. Bob learned to operate and repair equipment, including rebuilding engines and general repair, at a very young age. A new building was added to the family farm about every 3 years. Bob would saw lumber for a neighbor who owned a sawmill, and the lumber was ultimately used to build the family farm buildings which Bob helped his dad construct. When rural electrification came to the Effingham area, Bob learned electrical by helping his dad wire homes in the township. After 8th grade, when the row crop work was done on the family farm, Bob would work for neighbors running mostly 2-cylinder John Deere tractors. The model B John Deere Bob used on the neighbor's farm became known as "Bob's B" based on the number of hours he used it.

Bob graduated Atchison County Community High School; then attended K-State University where he graduated in 1966 with a degree in Business Management. Bob married high school classmate Sharon in 1965 and they have four children: Amy, Ken, Gary and Deb and four grandchildren, two grandsons and two grandaughters.

Upon graduating from K-State, Bob and Sharon moved to Independence, MO where Bob worked 5 years in management at the General Motors Leeds plant. Bob transferred to Arrow Material Handling Inc. serving as 1st Vice President for 34 years. In the 1970's, Bob was instrumental in setting up Inventory and computer systems, as well as a national telemarketing sales organization utilizing Bell telephone 800 #s and a trained sales force selling forklift parts, and assemblies/attachments to dealers. In the 1990's, Bob excelled at (and enjoyed) designing and marketing attachments that used Arrow forklifts but also fit skid steer loaders, telescopic handlers, and wheel loaders. Sharon and Bob made a business/pleasure trip to China in 1995 to work with manufacturers and suppliers of forks and seats.

In 1976, Bob and Sharon built a new home in Blue Springs, MO for their growing family and taking advantage of the excellent school system. In 1995, with the "nest" starting to empty, they built a new home on 2 acres along with a 3-bay shop in Grain Valley. Needing a tractor to work his land, Bob purchased a John Deere 430S then later restored and showed it. Another tractor was purchased, and the process continued. Bob has worked on, painted, and restored 27 tractors. Many of the restored tractors have been shown at 2-Cylinder Expos in Iowa, four were sold to club members and others sold to people in nine states from Ohio to Washington.



Bob currently owns a JD 430W, 530W, 630W, B Farmall, five JD garden tractors, a 1939 Chevy Street rod and would have more if his building were bigger. Bob's favorite tractor is a 630W like the new 630 his neighbor owned which left an impression on him. Bob has restored three JD 630s over the years! Bob has been a member of the GKCTCC since 1997 and served as 3rd Vice President for about 6 years. Sharon, Bob's children and grandchildren have all driven his tractors in parades and also plowed with them.

Through tractor collecting and restorations, Bob has made some great friends and met many interesting people.
