Who is Justin Read?

Justin Read has been happily married to his better half, Theresa, since 2001. They have a son, Dalamar who will be graduating from High School this May and heading to KU to study physics and chemistry.

How did you get interested in tractor collecting? Justin said that his dad's hobby was tractor collecting and Justin became interested while in high school. In high school Justin worked on two tractors as FFA mechanics projects. He started with an MT in his junior year, receiving Reserve Grand champion at the State Fair. In his senior year, his 1941 H won Grand Champion. That sparked his interest in collecting from that experience.

When he got married, he had a 1 car garage that could fit 3 tractors, so he stored his 1941 H, a lawn tractor and a David Bradley two-wheel tractor (which was his Grandpa's and he still has).

What's your rarest tractor? Although not really rare, his dad was going to sell a bunch of tractors in 2020, and their B was one of them. As he was discussing it with Justin, Justin expressed his interest in it, as it was the first Two-Cylinder tractor on the farm. His dad had bought a package deal of 5 tractors from the local John Deere dealer salesman. The salesman said he'd sell Justin's H dad called about in a package with four other tractors which included the B. The B was stored just 2 miles from the farm and Kenny drove it home. Then, Justin and his brother worked on it and fixed it mechanically.

What's your favorite tractor? The H is his favorite tractor. He said he was proud that he restored it and got Grand Champion by doing all the work himself.

He's also a member of a Ford Model A Club. His grandpa bought a Model A in 1979, drove it home and fixed it up. His grandpa gave it to his uncle after a few years. His uncle did a lot of woodwork on the car during the restoration. His uncle kept the car until 2010. Justin then got the car and took two 500-mile tours in 2017 and 2018. His uncle mused that Justin put more miles on it in two years of owning, than the 30 years his grandpa and his uncle owned it. In 2011, Justin stated that he acquired his other grandpa's truck, which he uses as a tow pig / truck. The fun of old trucks, cars and tractors, is driving them.
